

Year 3 Curriculum Plan: Autumn Term 2017

**Who were the Romans and why were they so powerful?  
(6 weeks)**

Literacy

**Children will:**

- Retell the myth of Romulus and Remus.
- Create their own Roman Gods and write descriptions of them using adjectives.
- Write stories in the style of Ancient Roman myths.
- Write a recipe for Roman food.

**Grammar and Sentence level work**

**Children will focus on:**

- Using capital letters, full stops, commas and question marks.
- Selecting the correct homophones such as *our* or *are*, *where* or *wear*.
- Including adverbs in writing to add detail.
- Using speech marks correctly.
- Using apostrophes to show contraction such as in *didn't*, *don't*, *can't* etc.
- Including a range of conjunctions in their writing such as *because*, *so* and *but*.
- Look at prefixes and suffixes.
- Use a range of imperative verbs (bossy verbs).

**Daily guided reading sessions and phonics sessions will continue throughout the term.**

Numeracy  
across the  
term

- Read and write numbers to at least 1000 in numerals and words.
- Know what each digit of a 3 digit number represents (hundreds, tens, ones).
- Find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number.
- Comparing and ordering numbers to 1000.
- Add and subtract numbers mentally including a 3 digit number and hundreds.
- Know and use number bonds to 10 and 20.
- Count in 2s, 3s, 5s, 10s and 100s.
- Use knowledge of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division to solve number problems.
- Be able to tell the time on an analogue clock.
- Add and subtract amounts of money to give change.
